


Electric Car Insider (ECI) has created a **Discounts and Incentives Pricing Guide** which provides consumers with the **best pricing available within a specific metro market.**

Using the Guide

How Utilities Use the EV Pricing Guide

Utilities contract with ECI to provide the guide directly to end-users on behalf of the utility. The guide can be used for internal programs (utility employee EV adoption), commercial accounts (key customer employee EV adoption) and residential EV outreach and education. All of the provisioning and support is offered as a turn-key service by ECI.

In most cases, this Discount



Complete explanations and instructions are given on how to qualify for and obtain the discounts, tax credits, rebates and incentives available.


Full Page Profiles

How Does it Work?

Metro Area Specific Pricing, Updated Monthly



The mobile app is updated monthly with new manufacturer and local dealer discounts. End-users download the app from the Apple or Google App stores and unlock it for a given metro area by entering their five digit zip code.

The app has tables that summarize and provide details of the discounts and incentives available for the purchase and lease of electric vehicles.

How is the Discount Pricing Obtained?

ECI collects pricing data from local dealers through phone calls and emails. There is no automated way of collecting real-time competitive market pricing – we "pre-negotiate" pricing by inquiring about available inventory and current discounts. These are similar to Costco and AAA discounts, but in most cases ECI researched prices are better because those prices are negotiated in bulk and do not reflect true market pricing on current month inventory – not historical price data.



Getting Started

The Discount Pricing Guide is a Turn-Key Service

ECI provides the Discounts and Incentives Pricing Guide as a turn-key service. Just tell us how you would like to provision the application and we'll take care of the rest:

Who gets access?

- Employees
- Commercial accounts
- Residential ratepayers

How should access be granted?

- ZIP Code entry (self-certifying as a ratepayer based on residence or work location)
- Authentication token (individual unique coupon code/unlock code)

How should download URL and access code be distributed?

- Email ECI can either provide you with a distribution program (admin database) or send the download URL + unlock code to your list for you.
- Web Page ECI can host a distribution webpage for you, or provide code your webmaster can place on your web page (intranet or extranet).
- Survey reward The webpage with download URL/access code can be the final splash page after an online survey has been completed.
- Promo Card The download URL/access code can be serial printed on a giftcard type hand-out for distribution at events to commercial accounts or retail end-users.

Event Support Staff Available

ECI has event staff available in most major metro markets to assist at events in the demonstration of the Discounts and Incentives Pricing Guide app, including big-screen demonstrations and Promo Card distribution. This can be done in conjunction with distribution of the print Electric Car Insider EV Buyers Guide and the display of our EV Educational Exhibits. The cost for Event staff is very modest – generally only \$200 per staff member per day (inclusive of all costs). The majority of ECI event staffers are experienced EV drivers, qualified to answer attendee questions about EVs.


